# ***Principal's View***

## **Tena koutou e te whānau**

Welcome back to Hampden Street School for Term 2. I hope everyone has had a chance to recharge their batteries and share a bit of family time over the holidays.

At the Mihi Whakatau I talked to our new whānau about savouring the special moments, like your children starting school for the first time. It is a big milestone for whānau as the children will be in the school system for the next 13 years. As a father of four I can tell you it goes very quickly. On Tuesday my eldest daughter, who is in the Royal New Zealand Air Force, spoke on behalf of the Defence Force at the ANZAC service in the Moutere. I was very proud, it was really the first time I had seen my daughter in this new chapter of her life, as an independent young working woman. Thinking about the significance of this, made the major milestone of our new tamariki starting HSS for the first time, all that more poignant for me.

This term is a winter term and with that we farewell sun hats for a few months and we break out the warm jackets and sweatshirts. It is really important that we encourage students to put their warm clothes in their bags when they take them off and to ensure these clothes are labeled. Opportunities to sponsor a round of Heads and Tails or the kitchen are still available.

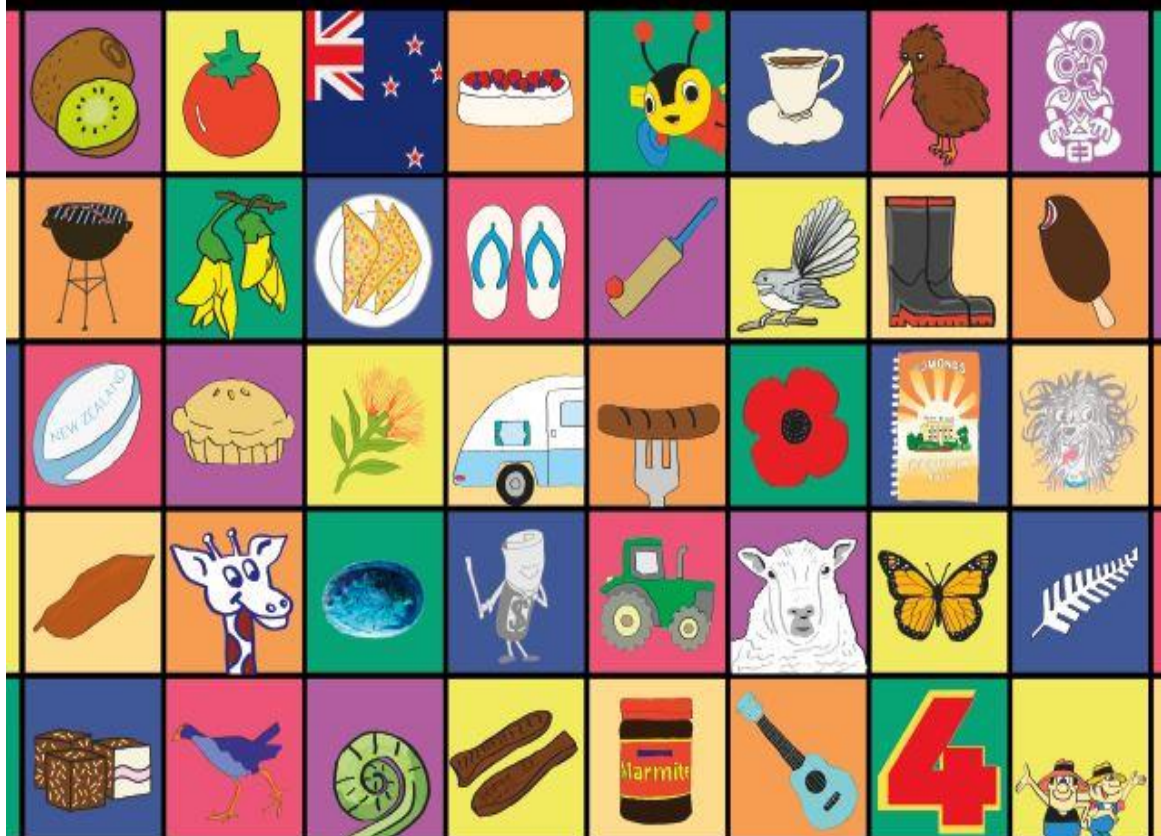
