Options are:


- -Sausage with bread and optional tomato sauce - \$2.00 each.

If you are new to sushi ordering and would like to pre-order and prepay a sushi order for Term 2, the flavours are: teriyaki chicken, smoked salmon (GF), tuna mayo (GF), vegetable. Sizes available are: rice ball, \$3.50 each (also available as a plain rice ball), four-piece pack, \$4.50 each or six-piece, \$6.50 each. Junior Coding and Robotics STEM Sessions

At HSS we are really lucky to have our very own specialist teachers who spend time with our classes sharing their amazing expertise. The Junior classes have been enjoying their STEM sessions with Karen this term.

The classes take turns to visit Karen in the STEM room and this term they have been exploring basic coding language. Tamariki have progressed from coding Toybots to moving around a grid on the floor, to showing their understanding of coding by drawing arrows to move Pirates or Splat the Cat to collect their treasure.

The sessions have built on from one another and the second session moved on to exploring more robotics – in particular a chance to drive and control the Spheros. The students worked well together to complete the coding challenges with the Bluebots, Spheros and iPads. Look out for more exciting STEM sessions in Term 2 – with a hands-on science focus!

Wow! Weeks 8 and 9 have been such a blast! They certainly have flown by quickly with two short weeks, but we know the Middle Syndicate tamariki are well rested and ready to finish the term off with a bang!



Firstly, we want to take you back in time to our Middle Syndicate Swimming Sports back in Week 6. We had such an incredible day with even better weather and the competition was on fire! We have also been unpacking pūrakau every Tuesday morning during Te Kākano time with the tamariki who do

not perform in the Te Kākano performing group. We were able to unpack the pūrakau of Pani and Kereopa, who kidnapped Kupe's daughter and made chase around The Glenduan area during our visit. We also learnt how to weave harakeke flowers, play kemū (games) with rākau and built pā and waka from driftwood, stones and other materials. The weather was scorching hot which made for a lovely day out.








Using the equipment is a great experience, being able to control it for everyone. The buzzers are quite fun and can confuse people - Jack and Indy


